

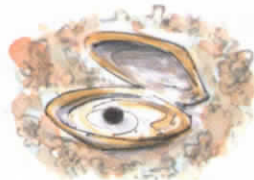
# Fun Zone Caribbean Deep Sea Diving

- Swim past a big swordfish as you play a LH E harmonic minor scale. First, complete the fingering on the blank lines below the notes. Then play.



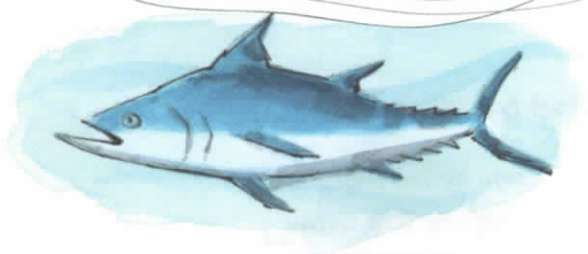
- Find a rare black pearl as you play these inverted triads with your RH. First, circle the correct inversion. Then play.



### Learning Link

The clear, beautiful **Caribbean Sea** is a part of the Atlantic Ocean. It covers over one million square miles between the West Indies and South America. The Caribbean is home to approximately 9% of the coral reefs in the world. These reefs are very fragile and sensitive to any kind of pollution. The reefs attract tourists to many of the islands of the region including the Bahamas, Puerto Rico, Jamaica and the Virgin Islands.

- See an old rusted ship's anchor as you play the LH primary chords in E minor. First, circle the Roman numeral name of each chord. Then play.



- Swim alongside a huge tuna as you write the counts under the notes. Then tap and count aloud.



- Watch the lobster crawling on the ocean floor as you write the counts under the notes. Then tap and count aloud.
